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Introduction

The R500 dough rounder has been built with the busy baker in mind. It is versatility and simplicity is unmatched in the industry. Production depends on the desired dough ball size and how fast the divided dough pieces are dropped into the funnel. Small pieces can be fed approximately two per seconds, whereas larger dough pieces (up to 2 lbs.) must be fed at a lesser rate.

Getting the feel of the machine will best determine just what the feed rate should be for any certain dough ball size. No adjustments are necessary when changing the size of your dough piece, it will automatically be rounded into a tight, smooth ball, with no more effort than it takes to drop them into the funnel.



Installation Instructions for Location

Select location carefully. The area should provide the operator with enough space to use the equipment in a safe manner. The floor area selected should be a flat surface, easy to clean, and should be free of oil, grease, etc.





Start up and Operation Procedures


- Ensure the machine and its components are clear of packing material, packing slips, documents, and other obstructions.
- 2. Position the R500 in the desired location and lock the two locking casters with their levers.
- 3. Plug the power cord into the proper outlet.
- 4. Press the green push button to turn the machine on.
- 5. The rounder drum should now be turning in a counterclockwise rotation.
- 6. Drop dough pieces (from 1 oz to 32 oz) into the funnel. The dough will automatically be rounded and then deposited back to the top of the cabinet.



General Overview Of The R500

The R500 machine has various components that are important to familiarize yourself with to effectively operate, maintain, and clean your machine.

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- 1. The Plastic Rounder Drum (Item 1) is the large gray drum that rotates counterclockwise while the machine is in operation. This drum is vital in providing the motion to round the dough ball.
- 2. The Rounder Base Assembly (Item 2) is the rotating assembly driven by the motor. The drum and the Plastic Seal Ring (Item 6) sit on top of the rounder base where the pins on the rounder base insert into the hook cutouts on the bottom of the Rounder Drum. The drum locks into place by turning it in a clockwise motion.
- 3. The Rounder Funnel (Item 3), which sits atop the Rounder Screw and Rounder Drum, allows the dough ball to drop easily to the bottom of the Rounder Screw (Item 5).
- 4. The exit ramp (Item 4), which bolts to the top of the Rounder Screw Assembly, assists with guiding the dough ball out of the top of the Rounder Screw.
- 5. The Rounder Screw Assembly (Item 5) is the screw or auger looking component which provides the path for the dough ball to travel back up. There is an opening in the top where the funnel sits, allowing the dough ball to drop to the bottom. It is then carried back up the outer surfaces to the top by the movement of the Rounder Drum. This movement allows for the rounding of the dough ball.
- 6. The Plastic Seal Ring (Item 6) is a plastic disc that sits between the Rounder Drum, Screw, and Rounder base Assembly.

General Cleaning Instructions

WARNING: Before attempting to clean the R500, make certain that the machine has been properly powered down and the plug has been removed from the power source. Failure to do so could result in serious injury.

All AM Manufacturing machines are tested with dough during the quality audit procedure. Although the machine has been cleaned, some evidence of dough may be detected, this is normal.

All parts in contact with dough should be washed thoroughly after operation with a mild soap and water solution. Disassembly of this machine for cleaning is outlined and illustrated for your convenience.

Cleaning the AM Manufacturing R500 is essential to ensure sanitary conditions and proper machine function. Regular cleaning will extend the life of various components within the machine.

Cleaning Disassembly

- 1. Shut off all electrical power and unplug the power cord.
- 2. Remove the funnel.
- 3. Remove the rounder screw by lifting straight up and out of the machine.
- 4. Remove the rounder drum by twisting counterclockwise and lifting straight up.
- 5. Remove the plastic seal ring, which sometimes may stick to the bottom of the rounder drum.

NOTE: If unable to remove the rounder screw, never put hands or arms into the screw.

- Add a small amount of warm water to soften the dough at the bottom, then turn off the rounder.
- The rounder screw should be able to lift out.
 - Improper cleaning or lack of cleaning will cause the rounder screw and base to seize within the machine over time. This can cause it to be extremely difficult to perform maintenance or clean the machine in the future.

Component Cleaning

- 1. Wash the rounder drum thoroughly with a mild soap and water solution.
- 2. Wash the rounder funnel.
- 3. Remove excess dough from and wipe down the rounder base.
- 4. Wash the rounder screw.
- 5. Wash the Plastic Seal Ring.

Post Cleaning Assembly

- 1. Ensure the electrical power is shut off and unplugged.
- 2. Place the plastic seal ring onto the top surface of the rounder base.
- 3. Place the rounder screw assembly so that the slotted part of the post on the bottom of the screw sits on the pin located within the rounder base.
- 4. Place the drum over the metal screw and lock it in place on the two pins on the edge of the rounder base.
- 5. Insert the funnel into the top of the rounder screw.

NOTE: DO NOT DROP ANY OF THE COMPONENTS INTO THE MACHINE. DOING SO MAY CAUSE PREMATURE WEAR AND DAMAGE.

General Maintenance

Read and follow the maintenance instructions below to keep the unit in good operating condition. Regular inspections and maintenance are essential to help prevent accidents and injuries.

<u>MARNING</u>: Before attempting maintenance on the R500, make certain that the machine has been properly powered down and the plug has been removed from the power source. Failure to do so could result

- The R500 has a single drive chain. This chain must be greased regularly with a bearing grease to prolong the life of the sprockets as well as the chain.
- Chain tension should be checked every 60 days.
- Inspect fasteners and ensure they are tightened securely.



Basic Trouble Shooting Guide

Issue	Probable Cause	Solution
Machine not starting	Power off or faulty push button or contact blocks	Check push button, contact blocks, plugs, and power source. Check the fuse, the overload in the electrical panel, and reset the overload on the motor.
Noise from bottom of the machine	Bearing wear, motor/gearbox issues	Remove the chain and run the machine. If noise persists, inspect the motor and gearbox. If noise stops, inspect the bearings within the rounder base and replace if necessary.
Uneven drum wear	Bearing wear	Inspect the bearings and replace them if necessary.
Rounder Screw Assembly Stuck	Lack of cleaning causing dough to harden and glue the post of the screw into the rounder base.	If freshly stuck, add a small amount of water to the area where the screw inserts into the base. If this does not loosen it, call AM Manufacturing at the number provided below.
Rounder Base Assembly Stuck	Lack of cleaning causing dough to harden and glue the spindle of the rounder base into the frame.	Call AM Manufacturing at the number provided below.
Rounder Drum Notches Broken	Dropping the rounder drum into the machine or not locking the drum in place prior to operation.	Replace rounder drum.






